## **Job Fairs**

Job Fairs are one place where you have some sense of control. You *will* get an interview, it may last more than a minute if you are lucky. But, it *is* getting you and your resume in front of a live person. It is one way to hone your interviewing skills and gain some confidence. It is unlikely that all the companies represented are of interest to you; assess companies you want to meet and consider the investment of time and transportation to make it worthwhile.

Note that it is important to prepare 10 to 15 hours for each Job Fair with regards to the companies being represented. You need to research each company to more fully understand the scope of their products and/or services, marketing strategies, and needs or solutions that you may offer them.
