But when they welcomed us on their dusty, humble streets in a borrowed car with their violins playing welcoming music we knew instantly, we were with both friends and family in a recent postcommunist country. Although we did not speak Russian, we initially spoke to them in Italian musical terms such as dynamics (forte, piano), tempos (allegro, andante) and with expressive terms (ritard, accelerando), and along other common musical terms with our Italian-English accents. Music can be indeed be an international language music much like love, compassion and kindness when applied to ones ancestry.
