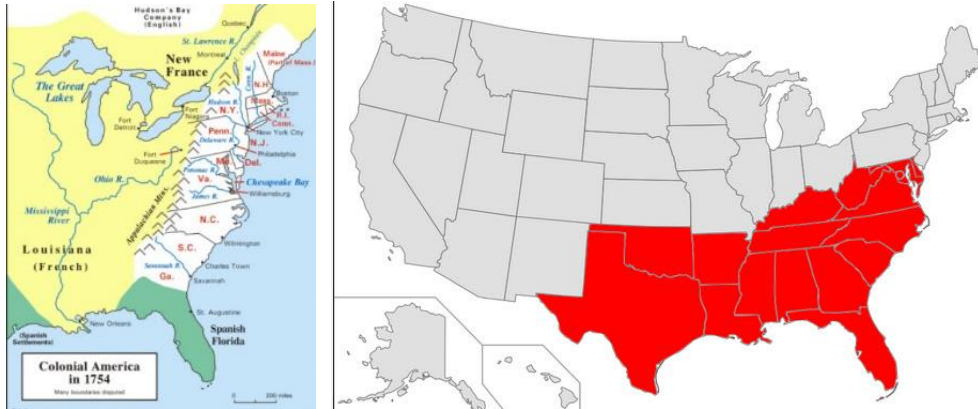
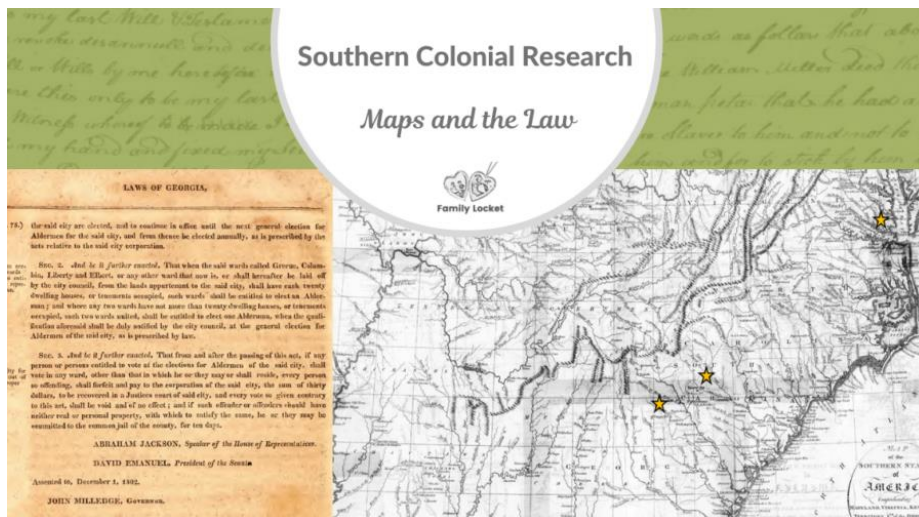

Note: Virginia (including parts of West Virginia), North Carolina, South Carolina, and Maryland were part of the early U.S. colonies. Florida, Louisiana, Alabama, Mississippi, Missouri, and Texas, as well as states and regions that divided from them, had colonial governments from Spain, France, and Mexico, with records being kept in these countries.

Expand Your Search to All 50 States and Different Regions

Many southern states problems can be solved using several different approaches, sometimes involving collecting circumstantial evidence that doesn't always appear to be relevant but when looked at as a whole it becomes helpful.

1. On the their Family History Guide in their State list (just below the Statue of Liberty picture above), access the State page you are interested in. Each State page has specific Goals and Choices, similar to other Projects in The Family History Guide.
2. In each State page, you can access a county of interest in the County list at the top (such as AL Counties).
