Wales is one of the four constituent countries of the <u>United Kingdom</u> (together with <u>England</u>, <u>Scotland</u> and <u>Northern Ireland</u>) and is located in the western part of Britain. From its original Celtic origins, a distinct Welsh national identity emerged in the centuries after the Roman withdrawal from Britain in the 5th century. 
PRE - 1974 COUNTY STRUCTURE
